The Home Building Association of Richmond (HBAR) came to Muster with the goal of implementing a digital grassroots solution to supplement their strong in-house lobbying team. Before using Muster, HBAR involved its membership in lobbying activities by emailing and calling a small group of stakeholders and requesting their participation. For nearly two years, the government affairs team at HBAR worked on a specific piece of legislation affecting the homebuilding industry. The team crafted a critical bill that ultimately passed through the General Assembly and was signed into law.
